




FIGURE 1: SCORECARD STRUCTURE

EXPLORATION EXPENDITURE IN QLD 2010-2022




EXPLORATION SENTIMENT RANKING 2021-22






PETROLEUM INDUSTRY SENTIMENT RANKINGS

- Prospectivity & Endowment –
 Driven by Petroleum scoring mildly negative, while coal coal and minerals explorers remained very positive.
- Social licence Coal industry respondents were neutral, minerals positive & petroleum respondents negative.
- Access to investment
 – In 2021
 was good news story, but
 since dropped to negative,
 driven by coal & petroleum
 response.
- **Policy Uncertainty** Negative sentiment felt very strongly by coal & petroleum.




KEY SCORECARD THEMES OVER SCORECARD HISTORY



12 MONTH OUTLOOK FOR EXPLORATION EXPENDITURE, 2021-22

- The 12-month outlook for exploration expenditure is quite positive.
- Almost half of explorer survey respondents forecasting an increase in spend of at least 10%
- More than a quarter indicate an increase of more than 25% in 2022-23.









GLOBAL AVERAGE BENCHMARK LNG PRICES AND QUEENSLAND PETROLEUM EXPLORATION SPEND, 2002-03 TO 2021-22

- Europe's energy crisis, the invasion of Ukraine and impacted energy markets saw record petroleum prices. The Scorecard's benchmark spot LNG price up by 224% to US\$26/ Mmbtu.
- Queensland petroleum exploration expenditure did not build on the growth of 2020-21, with exploration declining by 21% to \$236 million in 2021-22.
- Qld petroleum exploration activity remains critical to domestic gas market supply
